


DUMPSTER DAYS

September 11, 12 & 13 New Pittsfield Garage

The trustees are still doing three-day dumpsters. On Thursday and Friday, September 11 and 12 you can take your items to the garage between 9 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. and someone will be available to assist you. On Saturday, September 13, assistance will be provided from 8 a.m. to 12 noon. Any other hours, you will be on your own.

Only Pittsfield Township residents may take items to the garage for disposal.

Tires, hazardous liquids, oils, or appliances with freon are NOT accepted.

Oil and Auto Batteries can be recycled at Pier 58 Marine.

TOWNSHIP SHRED EVENT AGAIN

Saturday, September 13 9:00 a.m. to 12 Noon

The township trustees have secured the shred truck from the Lorain County Collection Center to be held along with dumpster days on Saturday for free.

Pittsfield township residents can bring documents that will be placed in a locked container for shredding to the Pittsfield garage. There is no limit to how much you can bring.

Please make sure that binders, binder clips, paper clips, plastic binding or rubber bands have been removed.

CEMETERY NEWS

Fall Clean Up will be November 15th.

Please have all summer/fall decorations removed and disposed of by this date. The township is asking for your cooperation in removing decorations. Containers are provided at each cemetery for decoration disposal.

The township cemetery sexton and the maintenance workers have the right to remove and dispose of any grave decorations.

CEMETERY REGULATIONS

Just as a reminder, following are Pittsfield Township regulations for all cemeteries.

- 1. Planting of shrubs and trees on cemetery lot is not permitted.
- 2. Placing of stones or marble chips around markers is not permitted.
- 3. All wastepaper, boxes or bouquets must be disposed of in the containers provided.
- The sexton and/or maintenance workers reserve the right to remove and dispose of any flower, wreath and etc. when they become unsightly.
- 5. Flower pot or urns shall be no larger than 10 inches in diameter.
- Poles or shepherd hooks for hanging baskets are permitted-the bottom of the basket must be at least 18 inches above the ground.
- 7. The placing of toys, articles of clothing, boxes, bottle, or cans is not permitted.

Pittsfield Twp. Historical Society was deeply saddened by the recent passing of Tom Sheffield, who served as a member since 2013 and as a board member since 2022. Although quiet, Tom was always present at board meetings and helped wherever he was needed. He was one of our loyal benefactors, donating money to help preserve Pittsfield's history. He was a big help during events, that last being the 60th anniversary of the 1965 Palm Sunday tornado. Tom was a survivor of this very tornado that destroyed his parent's home and paralyzed his mother.

In his memory, his brother Jim suggested mounting a sign or plaque on the 1836-38 Pittsfield school house with a description of its history. "After all," Jim said, "it was Tom's idea to do that." Tom will be greatly missed and hard to replace. We are in the process of making that happen.
